

## Flood Warning for Central Alberta

A [Flood Warning](#) has been issued for the following rivers in the Red Deer River Basin:

- Red Deer River upstream of the Dickson Dam, EXCEPT for the Town of Sundre
- Little Red Deer River

The Town of Sundre is protected by dikes from flows up to 1100 m<sup>3</sup>/s.

## Flood Watch for North-Central Alberta

A [Flood Watch](#) has been issued for the following rivers and their tributaries in the North Saskatchewan River Basin:

- Clearwater River
- Ram River

## Flood Warning Update for Southern Alberta

A [Flood Warning](#) remains in effect for the following streams and rivers and their tributaries in the Bow River Basin:

- Highwood River (including the Town of High River)
- Sheep River (including Turner Valley, Black Diamond and Okotoks)
- Elbow River UPSTREAM of the Glenmore Dam (including Bragg Creek)
- Fish Creek (including Priddis and Calgary)
- Jumpingpound Creek

## Flood Watch Update for Southern Alberta

A [Flood Watch](#) remains in effect for the following streams and rivers and their tributaries:

In the Red Deer River basin including:

- Red Deer River at the Town of Sundre
- Medicine River
- Raven River
- James River

In the Bow River basin including

- Entire Bow River (including the towns of Banff, and Canmore)
- Ghost River
- Kananaskis River
- Waiparous Creek

In the Oldman River basin including:

- Oldman River UPSTREAM of Oldman Dam
- Crowsnest River (including Municipality of Crowsnest Pass)
- Castle River
- Willow Creek (including Claresholm)
- Pincher Creek (including Pincher Creek)
- Waterton River and Waterton Lake (including Waterton townsite) UPSTREAM of Waterton Dam
- Belly River (including Mountainview and Standoff)

- St. Mary River UPSTREAM of St. Mary Dam
- Lee Creek (including Cardston)
- Little Bow River

A [Flood Watch](#) remains in effect for the rivers and their tributaries upstream of the major reservoirs in the Oldman River basin and a [High Streamflow Advisory](#) is in place downstream of these reservoirs.

As of 3 AM June 18, outflows from reservoirs were:

- Waterton Dam 77 m<sup>3</sup>/s
- St. Mary Dam 61 m<sup>3</sup>/s
- Oldman Dam 330 m<sup>3</sup>/s

A [Flood Watch](#) remains in effect for streams and rivers and their tributaries in the Milk River basin and the Cypress Hills including:

- Milk River (including Milk River)
- Ross Creek (including Irvine and Medicine Hat)
- Seven Persons Creek (including Seven Persons and Medicine Hat)
- Battle, Lodge and Middle Creeks

# High Streamflow Advisory Update

Issued at: 8:10 AM, June 18, 2005

Issued by: River Forecast Centre, Flow Forecasting

A **High Streamflow Advisory** remains in effect for the following streams and their tributaries in the Red Deer, Bow, Oldman, and South Saskatchewan River basins:

- Oldman River DOWNSTREAM of Oldman Dam (including the City of Lethbridge)
- Elbow River DOWNSTREAM of Glenmore Dam (including Calgary)
- South Saskatchewan River (including Medicine Hat)
- Red Deer River downstream of the Dickson Dam (including the cities of Red Deer and Drumheller)

As of 6 AM June 18, releases from Dickson Dam were 290 m<sup>3</sup>/s, which is well below bankfull downstream.

A major storm system continues to hit the province. Additional amount of 30 to 60 mm of precipitation are expected today in foothill and mountain areas north of Calgary today. All streams originating in and along southern mountains and foothills areas have responded rapidly to precipitation. These areas are saturated due to the heavy precipitation recorded in the past two weeks and water levels remain high in many areas. Alberta Environment is monitoring river levels very closely and is in close contact with Environment Canada Weather Services.

This advisory will be updated as the situation changes.

---

**A High Streamflow Advisory** means that stream levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly and **no major flooding is expected**. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible. Anyone situated close to the streams affected (campers, fishermen, boaters and the general public) is advised to be cautious of the rising levels.

---

**A Flood Watch** means that stream levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bank full. Flooding of areas adjacent to these streams may occur. Anyone situated close to the streams is advised to take appropriate precautionary measures.

---

**A Flood Warning** means that rising river levels will result in flooding of areas adjacent to the streams affected. Anyone situated close to the river should take appropriate measures to avoid flood damage
