

Flood Watch for North Central Alberta

A [Flood Watch](#) has been issued for the following rivers in the North Saskatchewan River Basin:

- North Saskatchewan River downstream of the Bighorn Dam (including the Town of Drayton Valley and the City of Edmonton)
- Nordegg River

The flow at Rocky Mountain House is nearing its peak, and is currently at 2300 m³/s. Most of the flow at Rocky Mountain House is from the Ram and Clearwater Rivers. Downstream tributaries such as the Baptiste and Nordegg Rivers are still rising. Current forecasts indicate that the North Saskatchewan River at Edmonton will be near bankfull by later tomorrow afternoon, with water levels increasing 3.8 to 4.6 metres from 10 pm June 18.

Flood Warning Update for Alberta

A [Flood Warning](#) remains in effect for the following streams and rivers and their tributaries:

In the North Saskatchewan River Basin:

- Ram River
- Clearwater River

In the Red Deer River Basin:

- Red Deer River (including the Cities of Red Deer and Drumheller)
- James River
- Raven River
- Little Red Deer River

In the Bow River Basin:

- Bow River (including the City of Calgary)
- Fish Creek (including Priddis and Calgary)
- Jumpingpound Creek
- Elbow River upstream and downstream of the Glenmore Dam (including the City of Calgary)

Current forecasts for the City of Red Deer are that peak flows will be between 2000 and 2100 m³/s and will crest Monday morning. At Drumheller, peak flows will be in the same range as those at Red Deer, cresting late Monday night or early Tuesday morning.

High Streamflow Advisory for Northern Alberta

A [High Streamflow Advisory](#) has been issued for the following rivers and their tributaries in the Athabasca River Basin:

- McLeod River (including Whitecourt)
- Pembina River (including Entwistle)

Flood Watch Update for Southern Alberta

The Flood Warning has been downgraded to a [Flood Watch](#) for the following streams and their tributaries in the Bow River basin:

- Sheep River (including Turner Valley, Black Diamond and Okotoks)
- Highwood River (including the Town of High River)

These rivers have peaked and returned to within their banks.

Alberta Environment is monitoring river levels very closely and is in close contact with Environment Canada Weather Services.

A **Flood Watch** remains in effect for the following streams and rivers and their tributaries:

In the Red Deer River basin including:

- Blindman River
- Medicine River

In the Oldman River basin including:

- Little Bow River

In the Bow River basin including

- Ghost River
- Kananaskis River
- Waiparous Creek

In the South Saskatchewan River Basin:

- South Saskatchewan River (including the City of Medicine Hat)

A **High Streamflow Advisory** remains in effect for the following streams and their tributaries in the North Saskatchewan and Oldman River basins:

- Brazeau River upstream of the Brazeau Dam
- Oldman River DOWNSTREAM of Oldman Dam (including the City of Lethbridge)
- St. Mary River DOWNSTREAM of St. Mary Dam
- Waterton River DOWNSTREAM of Waterton Dam

The Flood Watch has been downgraded to a **High Streamflow Advisory** for the following streams and their tributaries in the Oldman River basin:

- Oldman River UPSTREAM of Oldman Dam
- Castle River
- Willow Creek (including Claresholm)
- Belly River (including Mountainview and Standoff)

The **Flood Watch** has been ended for streams and rivers and their tributaries in the Oldman River basin including:

- Crowsnest River (including Municipality of Crowsnest Pass)
- Pincher Creek (including Pincher Creek)
- Waterton River and Waterton Lake (including Waterton townsite) UPSTREAM of Waterton Dam
- St. Mary River UPSTREAM of St. Mary Dam
- Lee Creek (including Cardston)

No further advisories are in effect for these streams.

This advisory will be updated as the situation changes.

A High Streamflow Advisory means that stream levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly and no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible. Anyone situated close to the streams affected (campers, fishermen, boaters and the general public) is advised to be cautious of the rising levels.

A Flood Watch means that stream levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bank full. Flooding of areas adjacent to these streams may occur. Anyone situated close to the streams is advised to take appropriate precautionary measures.

A Flood Warning means that rising river levels will result in flooding of areas adjacent to the streams affected. Anyone situated close to the river should take appropriate measures to avoid flood damage
